## **Summary**

Selva Verde Lodge & Private Reserve is doing another exciting Herpetological Symposium this year! The Costa Rican International Herpetological Symposium is back for its sixth edition.

You already know that Costa Rica is home to 5% of the planet's biodiversity and at Selva Verde, and you will experience that diversity firsthand. Though small in geographic area, Costa Rica has one of the highest densities of herpetofauna in the world with more than 440 species of reptiles and amphibians in a surface of 51,000 km<sup>2</sup>.

The Symposium will feature presentations and workshops in Spanish and English about herpetology and herpetoculture by organizations and individuals. Come and learn about new findings and research from all over the Americas and beyond or see how you can share your own work with conference participants and other interested people.

This is the 6th herpetological symposium at Selva Verde Lodge since they began in 2013. This event brings together herpetologists from Costa Rica, Central and South America, the United States and Europe, but we welcome herpetologist from all over the world! Join us for an exchange of knowledge, learning, and enjoyment of Costa Rica herpetology at its best!

# Highlights

- Hear from renowned National Geographic explorer and herpetologist Bruce Means, one of the few specialists in the Guiana Shield tepuis. Author of many articles and books, Bruce will enchant us with his memorable adventures at the far corners of the Lost World.
- Come and learn about herping in wild and remote places searching for rare snakes, and filming documentaries for Discovery channel with Myke Clarkson.
- Meet Mario Urriola, owner of Serpentarium Maravillas Tropicales in Panama, and learn about Panamanian snakes.
- Listen to Aaron Gómez, one of the leading snake venom researchers in Costa Rica, who works with the famed Clodomiro Picado Institute.
- Join Rodoldo Vargas Leitón, owner of Refugio Animal/Herpetológico de Costa Rica, in discussions about conservation and legal issues when working with amphibians and reptiles in Costa Rica.
- Connect with Milton Salazar, leading herpetologist in Nicaragua, who will enlighten us about the state
  of knowledge of amphibians and reptiles in that country.
- Learn about the work of Erick Arias, herpetologist at the University of Costa Rica, focused on some of the lesser-known amphibians, the salamanders.
- Join Cesar Barrio-Amorós, taxonomist and global herpetological explorer, photographer, and adventurer who has put together the line-up for our Symposium and will serve as our emcee throughout the event.
- Enjoy 4 days and 3 nights of talks and field exploration to observe reptiles and amphibians in their natural habitat at Selva Verde.
- Investigate the impressive natural history of the Sarapiquí River, search for crocodiles, turtles, basilisks, and iguanas.
- Visit the nearby Lapa Verde Reserve for a night hike!

**Transportation:** Transfers between Selva Verde Lodge and the airport or San Jose, a two-hour drive, are \$80 per person each way or \$160 round-trip. Pricing can decrease with groups of 4 or more passengers. This pricing is valid only for those arriving on September 03<sup>rd</sup> and departing on September 06<sup>th</sup> Please be advised that passengers will be grouped together and it may be necessary to wait up to 3 hours from your flight arrival or departure for transportation

**Payment & Cancellations:** Deposit and Payment: To confirm your reservations a 50% deposit is due. Final payment will be due by August 03rd 2026. Register before April 01st 2026, and receive a complimentary book, "Pocket Guide to the Amphibians and Reptiles of Costa Rica" by Twan Leenders. Cancellations received prior to August 03<sup>rd</sup> 2026 are refundable minus \$30 administration fee. Cancellations received between up are refundable less a penalty equal to 50% of the total cost of the symposium per person.
